

JOURNAL ENTRIES COMPLETION OF SBA

GENERAL OBJECTIVES:

On completion of the syllabus, students should develop:

- 1. The ability to perceive, understand and express in writing the concepts and feelings about Two-Dimensional and Three-Dimensional Expressive Forms they have created;
- 2. The ability to record ideas from direct observation and personal experience;
- 3. The ability to communicate by using appropriate materials and technologies in a disciplined way;
- 4. The ability to experiment, innovate and use intuition and imagination in producing works of art;
- 5. The ability to identify, research and evaluate problems in a systemic way;
- 6. A relevant working vocabulary in the art and design process:
- 7. An awareness and understanding of the holistic nature of the art and design activity;
- 8. An appreciation for the work of other artists and designers in the Caribbean in both a contemporary and a historical context;
- 9. An understanding of cultural change and the importance of art and design in the evaluation of personal experience in a multicultural society;
- 10. Positive personal and social attitudes;
- 11. The ability to produce samples integrated with historical, cultural and theoretical studies:
- 12. A well organized, comprehensive journal to include samples and supportive theoretical and visual material using knowledge of layout and design techniques.

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES:

After interactive discussions, research, direct reading thinking activity, social interaction, brain storming, individual discovery and independent practice, students should be able to:

- 1. List, understand and follow the stages to conduct 'research' and 'writing' about individual works of art.
- Conduct comprehensive research on EACH expressive form studied, artworks, materials used and referenced artist.
- 3. State the history of reflective journaling.
- 4. Understand what, why and how a referenced artist created a particular work of art for each expressive form studied' Namely:
 - Sculpture and ceramics
 - Textile Design & Manipulation
 - Painting & Mixed Media
 - Graphics & Communication Design
- 5. Document important aspects of the referenced artist life.
- 6. Create artworks using similar understandings and skills of a referenced artist.
- 7. Improve artwork based upon instruction.
- 8. Experiment with new media.
- 9. Write about the ideas or the inspiration and the challenges experience in creating each artwork.
- 10. Explain processes and experiences of each artwork created.
- 11. Display at least five (5) pieces of the referenced artists' work.
- 12. Write a critical analysis for three (3) pieces of the referenced artists' work using the four (4) steps of art criticism.
- 13. Compare and contrast one (1) piece of the referenced artists' work against one (1) piece of the five (5) pieces of your personal artwork.
- 14. Complete a well-organized, comprehensive reflective journal to include samples and supportive theoretical and visual material using knowledge of layout and design techniques.
